Uniform



At Cranbrook, pupils are expected to wear full uniform when participating in learning and at all school events both within and outside of the normal school day (unless stipulated by the school). We believe wearing uniform helps children to develop a strong group identity and a sense of loyalty to their school, as well as encouraging a pride in their appearance. Working with parents, carers and guardian we aim to ensure that all children arrive to school appropriately dressed for safety and weather conditions.

For Girls

Jade round neck sweatshirt with school logo, dark grey skirt, pinafore or trousers and white polo shirt (with or without school logo). In summer girls can wear a green and white check dress.

For Boys

Jade round neck sweatshirt with school logo, dark grey trousers and white polo shirt (with or without school logo). In summer dark grey smart shorts can be worn. No jogger, jeans or leggings to be worn as trousers.

Nursery

As above (sweatshirt and white polo shirt) with dark grey trouser or jogging bottoms if preferred.

Footwear

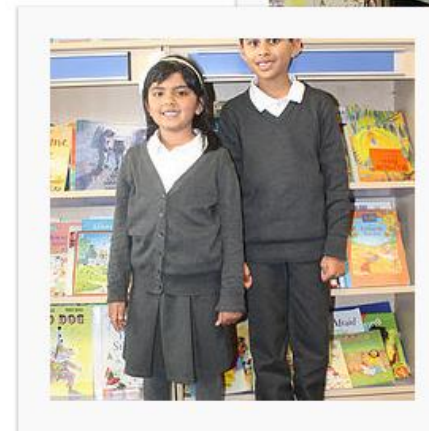
Sensible flat black shoes or boots in winter – trainers, flip-flops or backless sandals or shoes are not acceptable.

E-SAFETY

TIPS FOR KIDS

- ⦿ People are not always who they say they are online
- ⦿ Keep gaming friends "in-game"
- ⦿ Don't give out personal information
- ⦿ Learn the reporting processes in the game
ie. delete user, tell mum and dad





PHONICS

- Letters and Sounds - Contains games and activities that we use to help children with phonics. Available online for FREE.
- Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate **sounds** or '**phonemes**'. They are then taught how to **blend** these sounds together to read the whole word.
- Children have a 20 minute daily phonics lesson every morning.



PHONICS



- ◉ Phonics screening is usually taken individually by all children in Year 1 in England.
- ◉ It is an informal way for teachers to ensure that children are making sufficient progress in the phonics skills to read words and are on track to become fluent readers who can enjoy reading for pleasure and for learning.
- ◉ Due to lockdown, we will be reviewing the children's phonics this term.



HOW CAN YOU HELP?

Children need to practise hearing a series of spoken sounds and blending them together to make a word.

For example, you say 'b-u-s', and your child says 'bus'.

We have uploaded phonics words into the Homework folder.

READING AND CHANGING BOOKS.

- ◉ Please read with you children everyday.
- ◉ Reading does not have to only be the books from school.
- ◉ We will try and change the books up to twice a week but please remember to sign their Reading Record.
- ◉ The children need to be secure with the comprehension relating to any book.

HANDWRITING AND SPELLING



Nelson Handwriting is an upright, plain style.
It classifies the letters of the alphabet into five overlapping sets.

Set 1	Lower case letters which have hooks at the bottom of the a height.	a c d e h i k l m n t u
Set 2	Lower case letters which commence at the top of the a height.	a c d e g i j m n o p q r s u v w x y
Set 3	Lower case letters which commence at the top of the ascender.	b f h k l t
Set 4	Lower case letters which conclude at the top of the a height.	f o r v w
Set 5	Lower case letters after which no join is ever made.	b g j p q s x y z

No join is made *to z* either.

Nelson defines the joins between letters using these sets.
Only four types of join are needed.

Basic join	Set 1 → Set 2	i n m a k i
Second join	Set 1 → Set 3	a b i f c o
Third join	Set 4 → Set 2	o a f o w e
Fourth join	Set 4 → Set 3	o b f l w h
Examples of words with 'break' letters	bigger quiz pass boxer zebra open just table scissors lazy style
